Professor Jan Gehl, Formerly from Royal Danish Academy of Fine Arts and the author of 'Life Between Buildings'. Jan is directing a study of central Perth funded by the City of Perth and the Department of Planning and Infrastructure which will be a follow up to his 1992 study. Since that time Jan has become a household name in urban design having completed studies on Melbourne, Sydney, Adelaide, London and New York.

When: October 20th to 24th for the training and start of data collection

(followed by a chosen period in the following week for an intensive data collection process)

Course Outline: Students doing this course have the chance to learn the theory and techniques Jan Gehl has developed for bringing central cities back to life as attractive, viable and sustainable places based on catering to the pedestrian. They will not only learn the theory but will be involved in the actual data collection on the study of Perth. Examples of urban design will be provided from cities around the world and in particular how cities have been able to overcome their problems and give a new heart to their centres.

This is a unique opportunity available only to 20 post graduate students.

Cost: Some places will also be made available to professionals for \$3000 each.
